About the Presenter



Dr. Suzanne Sorel is Associate Dean and Director of Graduate Music Therapy at Molloy College where she has been teaching since 1991. She also is Director of Education & Training at the Rebecca Center for Music Therapy where she supervises staff, meets with families, and conducts assessment sessions. She practiced for 13 years at the Nordoff-Robbins Center for Music Therapy at New York University achieving Level III Certification. She wrote the proposal for the new NR training at Molloy College, where she and her team have just completed training the first group of Level I Certification Candidates. She has worked with a variety of populations including children and adults with autism spectrum disorder, developmental disabilities, physical disabilities, speech and language delays, and psychiatric disorders, and has presented her research, clinical studies, and improvisational workshops both nationally and internationally.

CMTE Description

Developing and implementing meaningful goal plans is an essential part of our clinical process and responsibility as music therapists. As a clinician and educator, Dr. Sorel has found when writing behavioral goal plans, the larger goal of helping people reach their potential can get lost in traditional goal-writing language. This 5 credit CMTE will explore innovative ways to incorporate behavioral, humanistic, and transpersonal philosophy in your music therapy treatment plans. Music therapy session vignettes will be shared.



Learning Objectives

1. Participants will reflect upon their clients/consumers' lives in order to identify potential goal areas to be addressed in music therapy
2. Participants will discuss possibilities for long term goals, short-term objectives, and methodologies that address behavioral as well as humanistic & transpersonal goals.
3. Participants will use sample assessment tools to evaluate live and video examples of music experiences and music therapy sessions.
4. Participants will learn about behavioral, humanistic, and transpersonal philosophy and treatment methods.
